ELIGIBILITY CLAUSE

"Any woman is eligible for membership in the National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution who is not less than eighteen years of age, and who is descended from a man or woman who, with unflinching loyalty to the cause of American Independence, served as a sailor, or as a soldier or civil officer in one of the several Colonies or States, or in the United Colonies or States, or as a recognized patriot, or rendered material aid thereto; provided the applicant is personally acceptable to the Society." (Constitution, Article III, Section 1.)

"Marriage in every instance in this paper means legal and lawful marriage. Date of marriage may be substituted for date of birth and death where such date proves the soldier to have been living during the Revolution and of a suitable age for service. (Note: Resolutions adopted by the twenty-fourth Continental Congress: Dowry acts of polygamous marriage can not be accepted as members of this Society.)

ANCESTOR'S SERVICES

The said SQUIRE HARRIS is the ancestor who assisted in establishing American Independence, while acting in the capacity of Pvt. H. J. (307 P. 25)
